School District Legal Counsel Agreement

This agreement is made and entered into this 30 day of 30 day

The District hereby retains and employs the Firm as its general legal counsel to provide the District comprehensive legal advice and consultation regarding all legal matters which might arise in the course of the District's operations and as requested by the District and as are more specifically set forth below.

- 1. The Firm will provide School District legal services under an annual retainer agreement on the following basis:
 - A. Labor relations services for the Teachers Association and Support Staff Association collective bargaining units which include the following services:
 - Collective bargaining including drafting of proposals and meetings with District officials.
 - Mediation, fact finding, super conciliation, grievance processing.
 - One arbitration (excluding just cause) per unit, per year.
 - One improper practice proceeding (including conferences but excluding hearings and appeals to the PERB board) per unit, per year.
 - "Day-to-day" advice (meaning either brief telephone advice or brief written advice) on all matters related to the above labor services or other legal issues that may arise.
- 2. In consideration of the foregoing, the District hereby agrees to compensate the Firm as follows:
 - An annual retainer of \$15,000.00 or \$1,250.00 per month, billed over the course of the school year (e.g. July 1st to June 30th) for legal services as outlined in "1" above.
 - All work not covered by the retainer will be billed separately as non-retainer work at the Firm's attorney hourly rate of \$195.00 and paralegal hourly rate of \$85.00 for general matters, with the exception of bond and note financing, for which a separate fee will be arranged.

- Legal services for litigation, hearings, and special education matters will be billed separately at the Firm's attorney hourly rate of \$215.00 and paralegal hourly rate of \$85.00. "Litigation" refers to matters under the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts and administrative agencies. "Hearings" are defined as any proceeding in which witnesses will be called, sworn, examined, and cross-examined before an independent finder of fact who will decide the outcome of the case.
- Construction matters will be billed separately, at the hourly rate of \$220.00.
- Only significant costs or expenses which are incurred by the Firm on behalf of the
 District will be billed to the District. Such costs are large photocopying projects,
 large postage fees, stenographic reporters' fees, witness fees and court costs.
 Travel to the District or routine office costs such as local telephone costs, faxes,
 routine copies, etc. will not be billable to the District.
- 3. The District will have access to all attorneys and professional staff employed by the Firm.
- 4. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024. The District may, in its sole discretion, for any reason, terminate this Agreement earlier than June 30, 2024, upon thirty (30) days' written notice from the District to the Firm, subject only to payment of earned fees, including a pro rata determination of the paid retainer, and disbursements as of the date of termination. The Firm shall also have the right to terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice.

AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE EDINBURG COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT AND

BROADALBIN-PERTH CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Edinburg Common School District (hereinafter "ECS"), and the Broadalbin-Perth Central School District (hereinafter as "BPCSD"), are both public school districts operating under the laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, both ECS and BPCSD have CSE/CPSE Chairs; and

WHEREAS, ECS is in need of a psychologist for evaluations; and

WHEREAS, both ECS and BPCSD believe that there could be a mutual benefit to continuing to create a relationship between the districts for mutual support and benefit

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of the above, and the terms of this Agreement, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. <u>Term</u> The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 in accordance with the terms hereof.
- 2. <u>Services</u> The BPCSD Psychologist will complete evaluations for CSE students including new evaluations as well as tri-annual evaluations and attend CSE meetings to review the evaluations with the committee and parents/guardians These meetings will be scheduled between the BPCSD Psychologist and the ECS CSE Chairperson.
- 3. <u>Payment</u> In return for the services described herein, ECS shall pay to BPCSD, \$700.00 per evaluation. BPCSD will send an invoice to ECS upon each completed evaluation. Such invoices shall be paid by ECS within thirty (30) calendar days. BPCSD will also bill for travel mileage between the BPCSD and the service location at the IRS rate in effect at the time of the service.
- 4. <u>Employer and Employee Relationship</u> It is agreed between the parties that The BPCSD School psychologist shall be a full-time employee of BPCSD, and shall not have an employer-employee relationship with ECS during the term of this Agreement. The BPCSD Psychologist shall receive all salary, benefits, and other compensation from BPCSD. The BPCSD School Psychologist is not entitled to any benefit plan afforded to the employees of ECS, worker compensation, unemployment insurance benefits, nor any other benefit, right or privilege available to employees of ECS.
- 5. <u>Termination</u> This Agreement may be terminated by either party with ninety (90) days written notice, or at any time by a mutual written agreement between the parties.
- 6. Renewal This Agreement may be renewed on a yearly basis upon the mutual agreement of the parties.

- 7. <u>Indemnification</u> ECS shall defend, indemnify and save harmless BPCSD its officials, employees, and agents, from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses arising out of or in consequence of any negligent or intentional act or omission of ECS, its officials, employees, volunteers or agents to the extent of its or responsibility for such claims, damages, losses, and expenses. EDINBURG COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT'S WELLNESS POLICY ON PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND NUTRITION

INTRODUCTION:

Children need access to healthy foods and opportunities to be physically active in order to grow, learn, and thrive. Good health fosters student attendance and education. Healthy eating can help individuals achieve and maintain a healthy body weight, consume important nutrients, and reduce the risk of developing health conditions. Between 2001 and 2010, consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages among children and adolescents decreased, but still accounts for 10% of total caloric intake. Empty calories from added sugars and solid fats contribute to 40% of daily calories for children and adolescents age 2-18 years – affecting the overall quality of their diets. Approximately half of these empty calories come from six sources: soda, fruit drinks, dairy desserts, grain desserts, pizza, and whole milk. Most youth do not consume the recommended amount of total water. Between 2003 and 2010, total fruit intake and whole fruit intake among children and adolescents increased. However, most youth still do not meet fruit and vegetable recommendations.

The Edinburg Common School District is committed to provide a school environment that promotes and protects children's health, well-being, and ability to learn by supporting healthy eating and physical activity within fiscal and scheduling constraints. Therefore, it is the policy of Edinburg Common School District that:

- The school district will engage students, parents, teachers, food service
 professionals, health professionals, and other interested community members in
 developing, implementing, monitoring, and reviewing district-wide nutrition and
 physical activity policies.
- All students in grades Pre-K will have the opportunity, support, and encouragement to be physically active on a regular basis.
- Foods and beverages sold or served at school will meet the nutrition guidelines of the U.S. Dietary Guidelines from Americans.
- The Edinburg Common School will participate in federal school meal programs (including the School Breakfast Program and National School Lunch Program).

- Classroom health education will complement physical education by reinforcing the knowledge and self-management skills needed to maintain physically-active lifestyle and to reduce time spent on sedentary activities, such as watching television;
- Opportunities for physical activity will be incorporated into the classroom setting.
- The district will participate in initiatives that promote physical activities at home.

Communication with parents

The Edinburg Common School District will support parents' efforts to provide a healthy diet and daily physical activity for their children. Semi-annually the Edinburg Common School District will send home and post on the district's website nutrition information and nutrition tips that will encourage parents to make use of the list of healthy food suggestions for celebrations, parties, rewards and for packing lunches and snacks.

Food Marketing in Edinburg Common School

School-based marketing will be consistent with nutrition education and health promotion.

Staff Wellness

The Edinburg Common School District highly values the health and well-being of every staff member and will plan and implement activities and support facilities that will encourage personal efforts by staff to maintain a healthy lifestyle. IV. Physical Activity Opportunities and Physical Education

All students in grades K-6 will receive three days per week of physical education for the entire school year. A certified physical education teacher will teach all

Daily Recess

Elementary school student that are eligible receive at least 20 minutes a day of supervised recess, preferably outdoors, during which Edinburg Common School should verbally encourage moderate to vigorous physical activity and provide space and equipment.

Edinburg Common School will encourage students to have periodic breaks during which they are encouraged to stand and be moderately active as part of the educational process (e.g., kinesthetic learning).

Research also indicates that having recess before lunch leads to less food waste and fewer behavioral problems at lunch. Outdoor recess as long as children are adequately protected has a benefits over indoor recess due to fresh air sunshine, but also psychological effects of leaving the school building. Recess will be held outdoors whenever possible and held indoors during the most inclement weather, at the discretion of the superintendent.

Moderate to vigorous physical activity releases brain chemicals that also help learning. Some school experimenting with more recess (four daily 15 minute periods in grades K-1 and two daily periods in grades 2-5 have found increased self-discipline and focus, higher academic performance, decreased misbehavior and decreased off-task classroom behavior. (Recess shall not be for punishment or reward.)

Use of School Facilities Outside of School Hours

School facilities are available to student, staff, and community members after the school day.

V. Monitoring and Policy Review
