D. Privilege of the Floor

- Deborah Wilson - Wanted to know why it was stated people would be socially distanced and following markings on the floor, when there were over 100 people in the gym for the beginning of the wake. Why can we open the school up for the community but not the families?
- Eric Dame - Handed a letter and supporting documents to the board from his wife Shaleah Dame who requested to attend the meeting via zoom and was denied. Eric read a letter to the board which is attached to the board packet. He stated he and other parents were concerned that if they bring their issues before Ms. Ellis that there will be repercussions to their children. As well as staff feeling the same. He would like to know why people are so afraid to speak up? Eric was also concerned about the motions made to go into executive session and if the reasons were legitimate.
- Martha Dietrich - Felt the service went well and they were all temped and masks were worn. She thought a lot of people from the school would have come. She believes a cleaning company came in after the wake to clean the school. Jim had done a lot for the community.
- Wendy Reu - Does not live in Edinburg, however feels she has many ties to the community. Stated what Jim did for the community was tremendous. If people are concerned about COVID then why are you taking your kids to places like Walmart?
- Paula Blackwell - Felt it was nice we opened the school up. She feels part of the problem is parents want a lot of answers they do not get (this stems from before the Lowerre situation too). Feels we should open the

school to families again. If you can open it for Jim's wake, you can open it for families.

- Jackie Nichols - Jim gave a lot to the community by playing Santa, delivering Thanksgiving food baskets and Christmas gifts. Would like to use the rest of her time for a moment of silence for Jim.
- Deborah Lowerre - Thank you for everything the school did. This allowed people to not have to wait outside in the cold and they could come right into the gym. The Knights Templar came and performed a ceremony at the beginning. She shared stories of Jim and wanted to say she appreciated all the love from the community.
- Angela Brownell - As a parent with a child in the school, I would like to know why there was not a half day or the service was moved to the evening to allow the children's routine not to be disrupted. Jim wanted children in school where they were safe and could at least get two meals. Parents want to be able to come back into school, when will we?

- Presentation of New Social Studies Curriculum by Joshua Schaperjahn
 - Our current Social Studies Curriculum has not been updated since 2010. The new curriculum is more cohesive. PNW BOCES S.S. curriculum is fluent for teachers and students. It also provides what is expected in 7th and 8th grade which will also help us prepare the students for those grades. The curriculum is all mapped out for you and provides resources.
 - Mary asked if there was professional development available for the other teachers and if the flow through to google classroom was adequate if we ever had to go virtual?
 - Josh said yes to both as well as he would be able to provide Professional Development in house to the K-2 teachers.
 - Eric wanted to know if the program was for the students to use as well?
 - Josh stated that it is the road map for the teachers to teach.
- Saratoga County Public Health and NYS Department of Health Updates
 - They continue to align themselves with the CDC.
 - We will update our reopening plan to reflect the changes in quarantine guidance and any masking mandates that will come our way.

- Edinburg Common School Covid-19 Updates
 - After the holiday break we had a big uptick in positive cases among teachers, staff and students. At this time, we currently do not have any positive cases or anyone under quarantine.
- "At-Home" Covid-19 Test Available
 - We are currently up to our 5th shipment of allotted tests. We continue to receive shipments from Saratoga County Health and HFM BOCES. We have provided 21 students with an at-home covid test as requested by their parents and one to every staff member.
 - We will be sending home another half slip offering more to the families.
- Nurse Updates
 - Our new school nurse, Marissa Tennant, LPN, started on January 24th.
 - She is a wonderful addition to our school community and we are thankful she is here.
- Computer Based Testing (CBT) Simulation (1/11/22-1/14/22)

H. Facilities/transportation Reports

- Welcomed the new laborer

- Transportation
 - The buses have some unforeseen maintenance repairs that total \$25,000 and \$20,000 to get bus 52 and 53 up to par.
 - The decision was made to take 52 off the road and reduce our fleet by one bus for the next 1.5 years.
 - We will be repairing bus 53.
 - Going forward we are not expecting to have such costly repairs. Unfortunately, the maintenance over the last few years was not up to par.
- Trane
 - One of the boilers that were replaced in October of 2022 went down. Trane was able to fix it. A week later the part broke again and they had to come back.
 - Trane came and fixed the roof exhaust fan
- Repair Reserve Money
 - Things that were noted on the building condition survey that we would like to use the money to fix
 - The Security System needs to be updated. Johnson Controls provided a quote for \$28,312.75 for a full overhaul of the system. Mr. Moore explained that there would also be additional cameras installed and they will have a 180 degree view.
 - The door by the kitchen and the pedestrian door at the bus garage need to be replaced. Three quotes were provided to give an idea of the cost however, they are expired and we will need to acquire 3 new quotes.
 - Hot water heater needs to be replaced. 3 expired quotes were provided to give an idea of the cost. We will need to acquire updated quotes when ready to proceed.
 - We will be looking for the board to accept the recommendations of transfer for the repair reserve fund.

I. Budget Updates

- A committee has been determined. It will consist of 7 people from the unions, BOT, community members and administration.
- At the moment, we are gathering information needed to proceed. The first set of state aid runs recently came out.
- We can go out with a 2.75 tax cap. Last year, we went out with a 2.7 and the budget passed by 1 vote.
- Last year, we did not have a lot of people come out to vote. We are looking into ways to get the information out to the community since things like the annual senior luncheon have been canceled.
- The next meeting will be on Monday, February 14, 2022.

- At the moment Ms. Ellis needs to work on getting contracts with the other schools done. Our contract to educate our 7th-12th grade students at Northville is up this year.
